Western Region Boy Scouts of America

As a movement whose leadership is overwhelmingly volunteer, the Boy Scouts of America recognizes the need to acknowledge the invaluable services that men and women render to youth. Of the hundreds of awards that the BSA presents each year to those on the local council, regional, and national levels three that are named for uniquely North American mammals, the Silver Buffalo, Silver Antelope, Silver Beaver, and Silver World awards are the most prestigious. Although the criteria are different for each of these awards, there is one common thread: The recognitions are granted by one's own peers in Scouting for distinguished service to youth. Other BSA awards, by comparison, are granted only to those who have completed a prescribed course of study or have participated in special training sessions.

The Silver Antelope Award, created in 1942, is granted for outstanding service to youth within the territory of a BSA region. The criteria are similar to those for the Silver Buffalo, with one major difference: A recipient must be a registered adult member of the Boy Scouts of America.

The Blue Mountain Council is proud to announce that past council president, Joel A. Eacker, will receive the Silver Antelope at the National Council Meeting on May 31, 2007 in Atlanta, Georgia. He is the sixth Blue Mountain Council Scouter to be so recognized.

Joel A. Eacker

Kennewick, Washington

Joel A. Eacker has served Scouting in the Denver Area Council, the Blue Mountain Council, the Western Region, and now the National Capital Area Council.

Joel was Membership Chair of the Columbia River District and served a three-year term as Council Vice President for Finance. He assisted in the organization of Cub Scout Pack 148 chartered to the Kennewick First Presbyterian Church and served as one of its first Webelos den leaders. He was an Assistant Cubmaster of Pack 148, a Troop Committee chair of Troop 148 and on the Troop Committee of Tri-Cities Elk Lodge Troop 275. He completed Wood Badge in 2002, served on the faculty of the Council Bighorn training, and has represented the council at several BSA National Council meetings. He was the council's contingent leader for the trek to Philmont Scout Ranch in 2003. He served two terms as Council President, leading the council to Quality Council status in 2004. He is currently the Vice President for Development for the National Capital Area Council, one of the largest councils in the BSA.

In 2005 and 2006 Joel served as the Area President for Area 1 of the Western Region. Under his active, involved leadership the Area led the nation in membership growth and many quality program areas. Joel also served as a Commissioner at the 2005 National Scout Jamboree and as a member of the Region's Camp Appraisal Team.

Joel is a Platinum Member of the Boy Scouts of America's Founder's Circle. He is a recipient of the Silver Beaver Award, as is his wife Margaret. Both of their sons are Eagle Scouts.

An active member of the Tri-Cities community, Joel was a member of the Lord of Life Lutheran Church and was the 2006 campaign chair and a board member of the United Way of Benton and Franklin Counties. A senior executive with CH2MHill, he was involved in numerous engineering and professional groups and led a project to replant the sagebrush following the Hanford fire in 2000.
