STEVEN A. CHRISTENSEN

Steve has served as Assistant Scoutmaster and Scoutmaster for a total of 6 years in three councils. He has served since 2008, as District Chairman for White Bluffs District. He has been a driving force for strengthening the district by recruiting a team of volunteers to help the district grow in membership, training and the friends of scouting program. He attended 21st Century Woodbadge and served on staff in 2011. He has received the District Award of Merit.

As an LDS Bishop, Steve focuses much of his time and efforts on the welfare and moral strength of the youth he is responsible to care for. His life sets by the example he lives, a high expectation of moral values in their lives.

In the community, Steve serves as a board member of the Pasco Grid Kids Football. For several years, he has organized the clean up efforts of local volunteers at the City View Cemetery in Pasco. He has implemented Teachers Appreciation dinners to show support for local school teachers and to thank them for their role in teaching youth. In 2011, he was an active participant and leader in the National Day of Service, organized by the LDS Church.

As an adult, Brian served in the Cub Scout program as both a den leader and Webelos leader, receiving the Den Leader & Webelos Awards. All the Cub Scouts in his den crossed over into Boy Scouts.

This scouter was the Assistant Scoutmaster for 9 years for Troop 179, Chartered by First United Methodist Church in Kennewick. Also, he has been the Scoutmaster for 7 years. He gives outstanding leadership, to the boys as well as the adults. He attended 21st Century Woodbadge and has served on staff. He runs an active outdoor program, with monthly camping trips.
