

Quality commitment and indefatigable dedication to Scouting are only two of the superlatives that describe Eric Geisler's Scouting years. From youth Scouting to Scoutmaster, his devotion to its ideals has never wavered. One of his friends has said, "I have never met a person who loves Scouting as much as Eric. He has truly a gift to give."

This gift to give has included leading his troop on several long term bike trips in the San Juan Islands and elsewhere in Washington state, organizing and leading district camporees and winter training and serving on Junior Leader Training and Wood Badge staffs; all the time instilling both practical outdoor skills and leadership skills in Scouts and Scouters.

Eric first served as a Scoutmaster from 1970 to 1972 in Calgary, Alberta while he was serving on the ski patrol at Lake Louise as a first aid and CPR instructor, and later as an avalanche instructor. Ski patrolling and Scouting have been a family affair. His son Neil is an Eagle Scout with 46 merit badges, while his younger son, Karl, is now working on his Eagle project. Penelope, his wife, has been active in Scouting since the boys joined Cub Scouts, serving in many capacities, including Wood Badge staff. Penelope and Neil are also ski patrolters.

Eric is presently a member of the Society of American Foresters. He has chaired its National Committee for Forest Roads, developed Best Management Practices for the Department of Natural Resources in Minnesota and developed new uses for waste material and new outdoor products.

Jim McCall was a Cub Scout, Boy Scout and Explorer and a member of the Order of the Arrow. He graduated from Oregon State University with a BS in Mechanical Engineering and earned his MS from the University of Michigan. He is self-employed and the owner of Reiff Manufacturing, a major plastics fabricator for several local industries.

Jim is presently the Chartered Organization Representative for Troop 305, having been Assistant Scoutmaster, Scoutmaster and Committee Chairman. We are pleased to announce the award of the **SILVER BEAVER** to Dr. Willard L. Meader. He was in Scouting as a youth and held leadership positions in his troop. Prior to moving to Richland, Dr. Meader had a distinguished career as a medical officer in the United States Air Force, retiring as a Brigadier General in 1989.

Dr. Meader served in numerous assignments, both in the United States and overseas, and was awarded a Bronze Star for meritorious achievement during his service in Viet Nam.

Following his retirement from the Air Force, Dr. Meader became active in business and community circles in the Tri-Cities and joined the council's executive board in 1992. At the time he became president of the council in 1994, he was aware of the council's precarious financial situation and accepted the challenge of improving the situation. Under his leadership the council executive board was re-organized, a successful search for a new Scout Executive as completed and efforts to obtain greater community support were undertaken. As a result of these initiatives an increase in community financial support was achieved which eliminated the council's operating deficit and achieved a balanced budget.

Dr. Meader served three years as president, beyond the normal commitment to this demanding office. He is now a member of the Oregon Trail District Committee, the council executive board, and a troop committee in addition to being an active merit badge counselor. Garry has been an Explorer Advisor, an Assistant Scoutmaster, both a troop and a varsity team committee chairman and a chartered organization representative. He served on the council's LDS Relations Committee for 10 years and has received his Wood Badge beads.
